ORDER FOR SURRENDER OF LICENSURE AND CONSENT TO THE SAME

Mario R. Munoz, P.A. ("Respondent") elects to permanently waive any right to a hearing and appeal with respect to this Order for Surrender of Licensure; admits the jurisdiction of the Arizona Regulatory Board of Physician Assistants ("Board") and findings of fact as stated herein; and consents to the entry of this Order by the Board.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Board is the duly constituted authority for the regulation and control of physician assistants in the State of Arizona.

2. Respondent is the holder of license number 3490 for the performance of health care tasks in the State of Arizona.

3. Respondent's license is subject to an Order for Letter of Reprimand and Probation; and Consent to Same issued in case PA-23-0083A ("Original Order"). The Original Order requires Respondent to participate in the Board's Physician Health Program ("PHP") and comply with terms and conditions of monitoring.

4. The Board initiated case number PA-24-0142A after receiving a report from 20 the PHP Monitor that Respondent tested positive for alcohol in violation of the Original Order. 22

5. Pursuant to the Original Order, Respondent entered into an Interim Consent 23 Agreement for Practice Restriction effective January 16, 2025. 24

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Respondent requests surrender of his license.

1	CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
2	1. The Board possesses jurisdiction over the subject matter hereof and over
3	Respondent.
4	2. The Board possesses statutory authority to enter into a consent agreement
5	with a physician assistant and accept the surrender of an active license from a physician
6	assistant who admits to having committed an act of unprofessional conduct. A.R.S. § 32-
7	2551(P)(2).
8	3. The conduct and circumstances described above constitutes unprofessional
9	conduct pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-2501(20)(k) ("Violating a formal order, probation or
10	stipulation issued by the board.").
11	ORDER
12	IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT Respondent immediately surrender license
13	number 3490, issued to Mario R. Munoz, P.A. for the performance of healthcare tasks in
14	the State of Arizona, and return his certificate of licensure to the Board.

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2. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that this Order is entered into freely and voluntarily and that no promise was made or coercion used to induce such entry.

3. By consenting to this Order, Respondent voluntarily relinquishes any rights to a hearing or judicial review in state or federal court on the matters alleged, or to challenge this Order in its entirety as issued by the Board, and waives any other cause of action related thereto or arising from said Order.

4. The Order is not effective until approved by the Board and signed by its Executive Director.

5. All admissions made by Respondent in this Order are solely for final disposition of this matter and any subsequent related administrative proceedings or civil litigation involving the Board and Respondent. Therefore, said admissions by Respondent are not intended or made for any other use, such as in the context of another state or federal government regulatory agency proceeding, civil or criminal court proceeding, in the State of Arizona or any other state or federal court.

6. Notwithstanding any language in this Order, this Order does not preclude in any way any other State agency or officer or political subdivision of this state from instituting proceedings, investigating claims, or taking legal action as may be appropriate now or in the future relating to this matter or other matters concerning Respondent, including but not limited to, violations of Arizona's Consumer Fraud Act. Respondent acknowledges that, other than with respect to the Board, this Order makes no representations, implied or otherwise, about the views or intended actions of any other state agency or officer or political subdivisions of the State relating to this matter or other matters concerning Respondent.

7. Upon signing this agreement, and returning this document (or a copy thereof) to the Board's Executive Director, Respondent may not revoke the consent to the entry of the Order. Respondent may not make any modifications to the document. Any

modifications to this original document are ineffective and void unless mutually approved
 by the parties.

8. This Order is a public record that will be publicly disseminated as a formal
disciplinary action of the Board and will be reported to the National Practitioner's Data
Bank and on the Board's web site as a disciplinary action.

9. If the Board does not adopt this Order, Respondent will not assert as a
defense that the Board's consideration of the Order constitutes bias, prejudice,
prejudgment or other similar defense.

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10. Respondent has read and understands the terms of this agreement.
